In fact, when you receive this letter early voting will have already begun on January 22<sup>nd</sup>. It will continue through February 9<sup>th</sup> with the special election being held on February 13<sup>th</sup>. The only thing on this ballot will be this Georgia Senate seat. The following candidates have qualified: Renae Bell (R), Tim Bearden (R), Ashley Godwin (D), Amber Nixon (R), and Robert Smith (R). As with many special elections voter turnout is challenging. Because this is an election with very short notice voter turnout is indeed concerning.

Exercising our right to vote has never been more important than it is in 2024. Please make every effort to vote in this special election. It is very important to Haralson County, and to my knowledge Renae Bell and Tim Bearden are the only candidates with any ties to Haralson County. Please be an educated voter and vote. A run-off, if needed, shall be held on March 12, 2024. Please help spread the word.
